PHILIP LUKE

Music in Bloomsbury is generally overseen by Philip Luke. In the church services, flexible musical patterns ensure a wide range of traditional and contemporary musical styles involving singers and instrumentalists of many nationalities.

Philip was born in Pembrokeshire, South Wales, receiving his first organ lessons at Llandaff Cathedral as a teenager. He studied singing at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama before entering London University for organ diplomas and research degrees. As a concert organist, Philip has played at numerous cathedrals including St Paul's, Southwark, Llandaff and St David's, and has participated in various festivals including the City of London. He has toured extensively in the USA and Europe, performing annually in the Czech Republic. In East Anglia - where he is based - Philip has an established reputation as a choral conductor in addition to regular appearances as recitalist at Wymondham Abbey, St Andrew's Hall, Norwich, and the Wymondham Festival.

Laurence John is the assistant director of music at St Davids Cathedral. He has previously held organ scholarships at Hereford and Exeter Cathedrals, and The Queen's College, Oxford.

During his undergraduate studies at the University of Oxford, Laurence was organ scholar at The Queen's College. He accompanied the chapel choir, described by Classic FM as 'one of the world's most renowned choirs', for weekly services as well as concerts, tours, recordings, and two BBC Radio 3 broadcasts. Beyond the college, Laurence played for the choir at Westminster Abbey, HM Chapel Royal St James's Palace and on a tour to America, where he accompanied services and concerts in many major cathedrals and churches, including Grace Cathedral, San Francisco.

He has worked as an organist, pianist, and harpsichordist with a number of the country's leading orchestras, including the Academy of Ancient Music, City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra, and Instruments of Time and Truth. Whilst a student at Hereford Cathedral School, Laurence accompanied the internationally acclaimed Cantabile Girls' Choir and played for winning performances by the choir in the final of Songs of Praise School Choir of the Year competition and at the International Eisteddfod in Llangollen; broadcast on BBC One and S4C respectively.

James Orford is a prize-winning organist and pianist based in London. He is currently the Organist and Assistant Director of Music at St Paul's Church, Knightsbridge and is pursuing a portfolio freelance career, working as both a soloist and accompanist. He has a vast amount of experience in a wide range of disciplines having worked in a variety of institutions. His most recent positions include being the Acting College Organist and Head of Organ at Eton College and the Organist in Residence at Westminster Cathedral. He has also completed organ scholarships at St Paul's and Truro Cathedrals, the Royal Hospital Chelsea, and King's College, London.

Having started his organ studies with James McVinnie and Christian Wilson, he later studied with Bine Bryndorf and David Titterington at the Royal Academy of Music. He obtained top marks in both his undergraduate and postgraduate degrees and was awarded the Duchess of Gloucester's award for exemplary studentship upon completion of his undergraduate course. In recognition of this, he was subsequently awarded one of the Academy's prestigious Bicentenary Scholarships for his Master's degree.

Organist, lecturer, and pedagogue Katelyn Emerson, hailed as "one of the world's most promising organists" (Listvinafélag Hallgrímskirkju, Iceland), is internationally renowned for performances throughout North America, Europe, and Asia that are "thrilling from beginning to end" and that showcase repertoire from the 14th—21st centuries with "impressive technical facility and musicianship" (Cleveland Classical). Upcoming and past recital venues include Walt Disney Hall (Los Angeles, California), Hallgrímskirja (Reykjavik, Iceland), Krasnoyarsk Philharmonic Hall (Russia), Basílica de Santa Maria de Montserrat (Spain), Cathédrale Saint-Omer (France), Kurhaus Wiesbaden (Germany), Auditorio Nacional de Música (Madrid, Spain), Cathédrale St-Quentin (Hasselt, Belgium), Hauptkirche St. Petri (Hamburg, Germany), Riverside Church (New York), Västerås Cathedral (Sweden), Longwood Gardens (Pennsylvania), Musashino Civic Cultural Hall (Japan), Cadet Chapel (West Point, New York), Basilika St. Lambertus (Düsseldorf, Germany), Benaroya Hall (Seattle, Washington), and Merrill Auditorium (Portland, Maine), among others, as well as inaugural performances at churches that include St. Thomas Church Fifth Avenue and Trinity Wall Street (both New York).

Prizewinner of competitions on three continents, Katelyn garners acclaim from listeners new to classical music and audiences of organ aficionados and colleagues alike for her "beautifully designed program[s]" (Orgue Canada), "refreshingly original and interesting" program notes (The Diapason), and "careful ear and sense of musicality that puts her at the top of recitalists performing today" (Journal of American Organbuilding). Having been awarded first prize in the American Guild of Organists' (AGO) 2016 National Young Artists' Competition in Organ Performance (Houston, Texas), the Guild's premier performance competition, Katelyn performed at the 2018 National Convention of the AGO in Kansas City (Missouri) after having given over 70 concerts throughout the United States and Europe in the intervening two years. She received the Second Jean Boyer Award in the 2014 Fifth International Organ Competition "Pierre de Manchicourt" (Béthune and Saint-Omer, France), the second prize of the 2015 Arthur Poister Scholarship Competition (Syracuse, New York), and the third prize of the VIII Musashino International Organ Competition (Tokyo, Japan). Katelyn was awarded the title of "Laureate" and Third Place, as well as recital prizes, when competing as the youngest finalist in the VIII Mikael Tariverdiev International Organ Competition (Kaliningrad, Russia). Winner of the 2011 Region V AGO/Quimby Regional Competition for Young Organists (Lexington, Kentucky), she has also received numerous scholarships for her musical and academic work, including the 2013 M. Louise Miller Scholarship and the 2015 McClelland Community Music Foundation Scholarship. Katelyn was selected as part of the inaugural "20 under 30 - Class of 2015" for The Diapason magazine, a group of "young talents in the fields of organ and harpsichord performance, organ and harpsichord building, carillon, and church music" who show "superior accomplishments, leadership, creativity, and innovative thinking." Katelyn's two CD recordings appear on the Pro Organo label: Evocations (2017), featuring the historic 1936 Aeolian-Skinner organ at the Church of the Advent (Boston, Massachusetts) and Inspirations (2018), sponsored by the Andover Organ Company in honor of their 70th anniversary and recorded on their Op. 114 at Christ Lutheran Church (Baltimore, Maryland). Her interviews and performances are regularly heard on such radio programs as Radio Russia, American Public Media's Pipedreams, WXXI-FM's With Heart and Voice, Radio VM's Récit au grand orgue, Québec, Canada, and Radio Présence, Toulouse, France ...

Organists Online was set up by Philip Norman in 2000 to help churches, choirs and funeral directors find organists. Although only intended to serve London north of the Thames, successive generations of the site have enabled the service to be rolled out across the world and there are now over 1,400 Registered organists. There is an untold number of churches, choirs, singers and non-listed organists using the site, which also offers downloadable information about video fees, statistical surveys of fees in general, and serves as a co-ordinating place for a variety of professionally related questions as they are posed. Nothing is charged for using most of Organists Online's facilities.

Philip organises music for the North Monmouthshire Ministry Area, a consortium of seventeen parishes near Abergavenny, Wales.

He also runs *Philip Norman Music Services*: www.pnms.co.uk.

The Organ in Bloomsbury Central Baptist Church

The present organ was originally built by Brindley & Foster in 1914 at the front of the church. It was rebuilt and moved to the rear gallery by Hill, Norman & Beard in 1964-8. J H Males rebuilt it in 1990. In 2006-8 B C Shepherd & Sons replaced most of the pipes with pipes by J J Binns of Leeds, mainly from Beechen Grove Baptist Church Watford, with a few stops from St Augustine's Tonge Moor, Bolton. Several extra stops were added including a 32ft reed, the Tuba and Vox Humana. At this time John Males refurbished the console, fitting new stop jambs. The tonal work was carried out by John & Eric Shepherd.
